## #12- DISCERN

- 1 Kings 3:9 Give therefore thy servant an <u>understanding</u> heart to judge thy people, that I may discern between good and bad: for who is <u>able</u> to judge this thy so great a people?
- 2 Samuel 14:17 Then thine <u>handmaid</u> said, The <u>word</u> of my lord the king shall now be <u>comfortable</u>: for as an angel of God, so is my lord the king to discern good and bad: therefore the LORD thy <u>God</u> will be with thee.
- Ezekiel 44:23 And they shall teach my people the <u>difference</u> between the <u>holy</u> and profane, and cause them to discern between the unclean and the clean.
- Hebrews 5:14 But **strong** meat belongeth to them that are of **full** age, even those who by **reason** of use have their senses **exercised** to discern both good and evil.
- Job 4:16 It <u>stood</u> still, but I could not discern the form thereof: an image was <u>before</u> mine <u>eyes</u>, there was <u>silence</u>, and I heard a <u>voice</u>, saying,
- Job 6:30 Is there *iniquity* in my *tongue*? cannot my taste discern perverse things?
- Jonah 4:11 And should not I <u>spare</u> Nineveh, that <u>great</u> city, wherein are more than sixscore thousand <u>persons</u> that cannot discern between their right hand and their left hand; and also much cattle?
- Luke 12:56 Ye <u>hypocrites</u>, ye can discern the <u>face</u> of the <u>sky</u> and of the earth; but how is it that ye do not discern this <u>time</u>?

Malachi 3:18 - Then shall ye return, and discern between the <u>righteous</u> and the wicked, between him that serveth God and him that <u>serveth</u> him not.
